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26.11 Admission to Minority Status Colleges:

The admission process in minority institutions will be conducted entirely through online means. To complete the registration, allocation, and admission process for admission to minority colleges, a separate link will be available on the portal (https://epravesh.mponline.gov.in). All minority institutions must register their institution on the Higher Education Department's portal and provide information regarding the courses/subjects operated by the affiliated university, the number of seats, fees, etc. This information must be verified by the respective university by the specified date.

There will be no reservation binding for SC/ST/OBC in minority institutions. The allocation process for admission to minority institutions will be done in a ratio of 01:01 (Minority Category: Non-Minority Category).

*26.12 According to Clause 6.4, during the final phase of the C.L.C., reserved category vacancies will be converted to the unreserved (general) category if no applicants from the reserved category are available, as per the timetable mentioned earlier.

26.13 Reservation rules issued by the government from time to time will be followed.

26.14 For courses where the ordinance specifies admission through a written examination, eligible applicants must register on the portal and indicate their preference for the institution and course. The concerned institution will conduct the entrance examination for the registered applicants and admit students according to the rules. The details of the admitted students must be compulsorily entered on the portal.

27. Weightage:

Weightage will be given for determining merit order but not for eligibility. It will be applicable to the percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying examination. It is mandatory to mention all necessary certificates for weightage in the application form for registration. The relevant certificates mentioned in the registration application form must be uploaded for verification. If multiple weightages are applicable, only the highest weightage will be granted in one category.

In colleges designated for sports, 5 seats beyond the total number of seats will be reserved outright for students who have attained 'A' category in sports.

For applicants attaining 'A' category in Arts and Culture (Youth Festival) / NCC / NSS / Scout and Red Cross Society, an additional 55 seats will be reserved outright in each college.

Applicants from State/Division/District-level competitions will be admitted based on merit and weightage in categories B, C, and D.

If the number of outright applicants exceeds, the seats will be increased accordingly.

27.1 For Students Participating in Sports Competitions

Category A Special Incentive Outright

1. Athletes who have participated in Olympic Games / World Cup Championships / Commonwealth Games / Asian Games / Asian Championships / South Asian Games / Paralympic Games / International Youth Games.





2. Athletes who have attained the first, second, or third positions or represented in national-level competitions organized by SGFI or authorized national sports competitions organized by recognized sports associations by the Government of India, including:

- National Games held biennially by the Indian Olympic Association.

- Junior Competitions / National Games / Federation Cup Senior Nationals / Inter-Zonal Nationals /

National School Games.

- Under 17/19 competitions / Khelo India School Youth Games Under 17/21 / Youth / Junior

National / Sub-Junior / Zonal National Competitions.

If eligibility criteria are met, outright admission will be granted without determining merit.

Calculation of Working Days for the Academic Session 2022-23 (Annual System for Undergraduate First/Second/Third Year)

(A) Details of Holidays and Extracurricular Activities:

1. Sundays: 52 days

2. General Holidays: 18 working days

3. Local Holidays: 3 working days

4. Diwali Holidays: 5 working days

5. Student Union Formation / College Cultural Activities, etc.: 15 working days

Total: 93 days

(B) Non-Teaching Days for Exams / Summer Vacation:

1. Pre-Exam Preparation: 6 working days

2. Exam Period: 35 working days

3. Summer Vacation: 36 working days

Total: 77 working days

(C) Total Non-Teaching Days (A + B): 93 + 77 = 170 days

(D) Total Teaching Days: 365 - 170 = 195 days

Note: If, due to unavoidable reasons, the number of teaching days falls below the prescribed standard of 180 days, the college/university level may extend the academic term as necessary to meet the required teaching days. This ensures adherence to the academic calendar on schedule. If teaching days are insufficient, additional classes will be conducted to complete the curriculum.
